

Bunnies-n-Chics

Free Pattern by Megan Tucker
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Supplies Needed:

1/8 yard muslin for bunnies
Scraps of yellow fabric for chics
Embroidery thread for noses
Buttons for bunny eyes
Barn Red Felt (optional)
Decorative Buttons (Optional)
Fiberfill stuffing
Thread and needle
Instant tea and sponge brush
Optional, cinnamon



Instructions:

Print out template onto cardstock. Cut out & trace onto wrong side of doubled muslin or yellow fabric. Sew on traced line all the way around chics and bunnies. I put a box bottom in my bunnies. You can find a tutorial for box bottoms on my blog at www.americanprim.blogspot.com You can weigh the bunnies down with some pellets or play sand. They'll sit better that way.

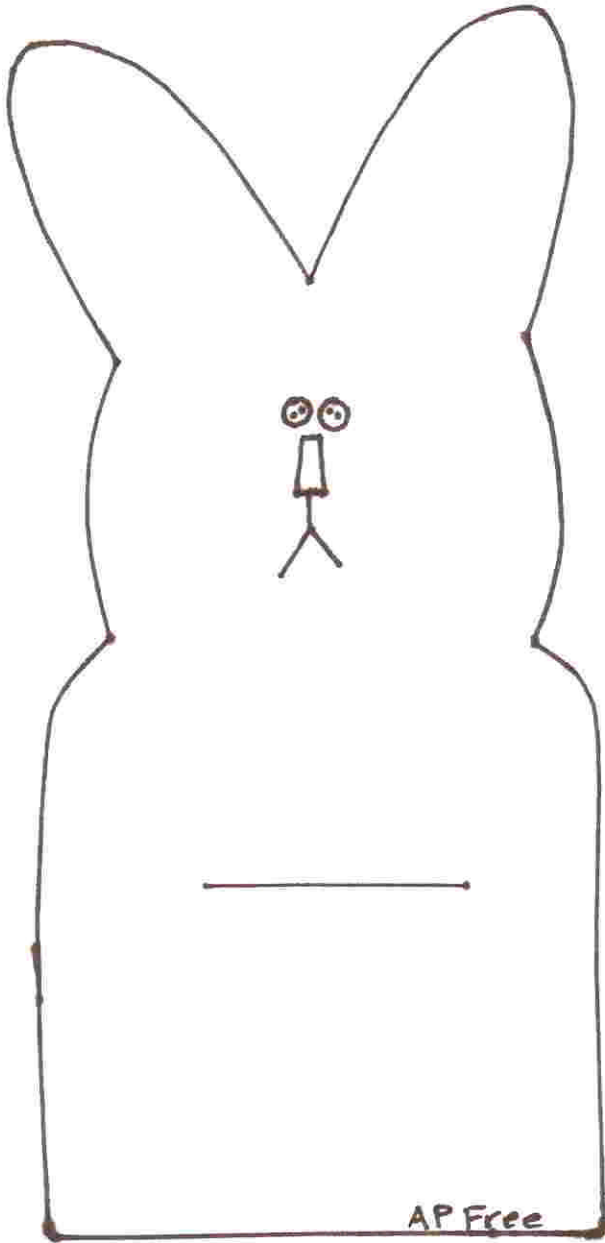
Cut slit thru one layer of fabric and turn right sides out. Stuff firmly and then whipstitch the openings closed.

Mix coffee or tea stain and brush onto bunnies and chics. Place FACE DOWN on a cookie sheet and place in oven on LOWEST setting or let dry overnight.

Bunny Faces:

I used 2 strands of embroidery floss to stitch the noses and I used one strand of black to attach the eyes. You can either go in from the back of the head OR from under where the button eye will be. Use a stencil brush and barn red paint or a pink shade to dry brush the cheeks and ears. I attached a barn red felt heart to one bunny using 1 strand of black embroidery floss and attached heart buttons on the other using 3 strands of pink embroidery floss.
