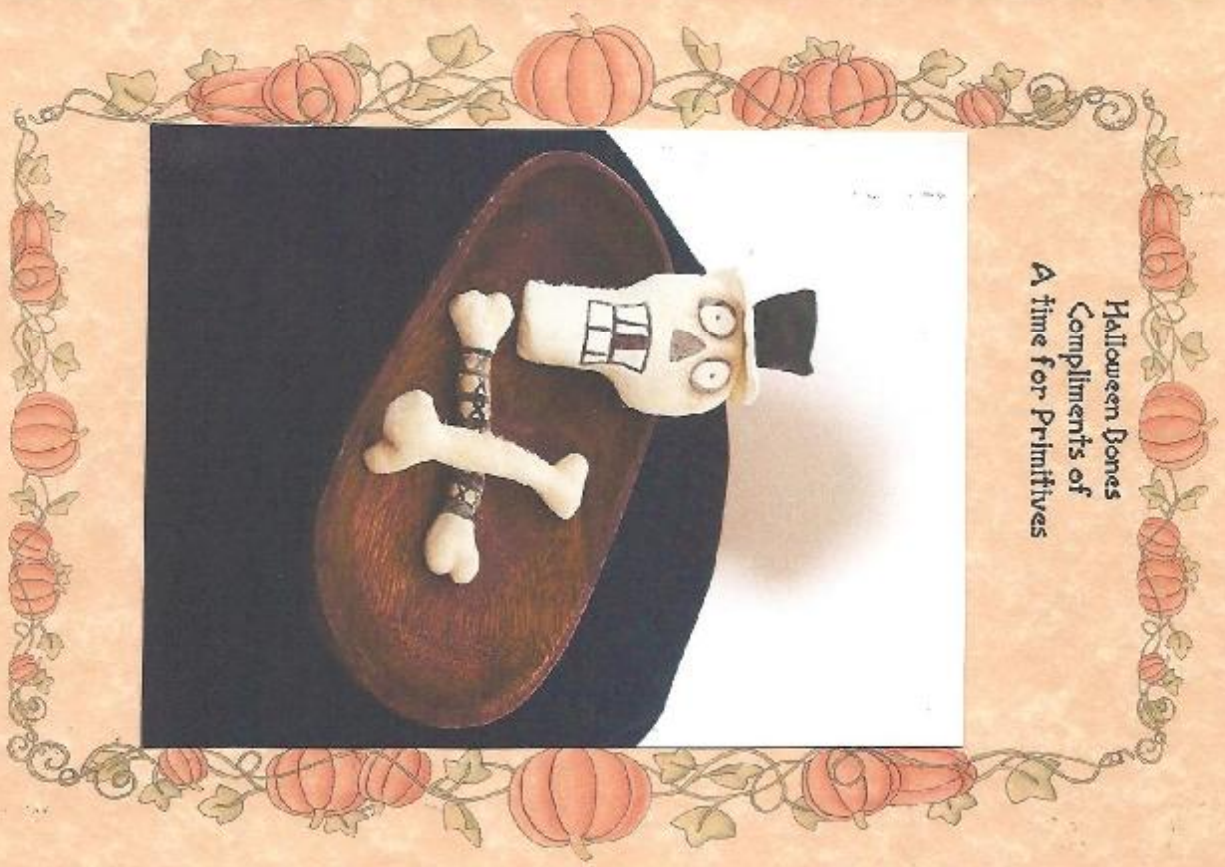


Supplies

- Poly fill
- Scraps of muslin
- Acrylic Paints in: Antique white, black
- Brown shadow
- fine grain sand paper
- Paint brushes

Halloween "Bones" Bowl Fillers

Supplies:

Left over muslin
Antique white paint, Black paint,
Eye shadow in brown
Stuffing and stuffing tool
Fine grain sand paper (opt)

Read all the instructions before making these and email me if you need help.

Cut out your pattern and lay it on the muslin. With a pencil draw around the pattern ...this will become your stitching line. Sew up your pattern leaving open where indicated. On one side of Bones head slit a small line through only one piece of material. Before turning right side out through this hole you need to clip all the curves and any stress places that you see. Turn right side out and stuff firmly. Whip stitch the opening closed.

Bones

Sew up leaving open where indicated, clip all the curves and stress places and turn right side out. Stuff firmly and then whip stitch the opening shut. Do the other one just the same.

Bones Hat

Sew around the brim of the hat and then clip all the curves. Make a tiny slit in one piece of material just large enough to turn the brim right side out. You will place the top of the hat over this hole and it wont show when you are done. Turn the brim right side out. Next stitch the top of the hat on three sides leaving the bottom open. Clip the curves and turn it right side out...Lightly stuff the top of the hat. Turn the raw edges into the inside of the top of the hat and place the top over the the hole in the brim. Whip stitch the top of the hat to the brim and set aside.

Painting

With watered down antique white paint you will paint the head, the bones and the brim of the hat. I paint on tin foil so I can lay my items down and they don't stick. Set them aside to dry. Next you can sand them, but this is optional. Looking at the pattern with a pencil draw in the facial features. Next you will paint them black and set them aside to

dry. If you want you can decorate one of the bones like I did or leave it like a plain. Paint the top part of the hat black and set aside to dry. When dry you can sand the facial features and then I took some brown eye shadow and carefully went around the eyes on Bones. I also defined the bones with a little brown shadow. You can finish him up any way you want, but I sewed his hat to his head off to one side.

This is a great pattern and fast too...it would look good in a bowl of putka pods with little Halloween Candy Corns (wax or fabric) around it too.
