- Fat quarter Warm & Natural Polyester Stuffing
- Needle and Thread
- Felting Needle
- Pencil or fabric pen for tracing
- Coffee for staining
- Felted wool in black, orange and antique white
- Cardstock paper
- 1 inch x 12 inch fabric for scarf
- Small piece of fabric for hat
- 4 rusty bells
- Small spray bottle (optional)
- Cinnamon
- Hot glue gun
- Sewing machine

## **BRRR! Snowman Ornament**

### Supplies:

Fat quarter Warm & Natural  
Polyester Stuffing  
Needle and Thread  
Felting Needle  
Pencil or fabric pen for tracing  
Coffee for staining  
Felted wool in black, orange and antique white  
Cardstock paper  
1 inch x 12 inch fabric for scarf  
Small piece of fabric for hat  
4 rusty bells  
Small spray bottle (optional)  
Cinnamon  
Hot glue gun  
Sewing machine

### Instructions:

#### **Sewing Your Snowman**

First thing you'll need to do is trace snowman onto doubled warm and natural batting. Use a pencil or pen to trace the patterns. (\*Tip: I like to cut the pattern and then trace it onto cardstock. That way I have a stiffer pattern that I can reuse over and over again). Once you have your snowman traced, cut around the traced lines. Do not cut right on the traced lines. Instead cut about inch outside of the traced lines. Sew your snowman piece together. Cut a 1 inch slit on the back. Turn right side out and stuff firmly. Stitch opening closed. Cut and trace the arms on warm and natural. Sew them together and turn them right side out and stuff. Stitch each arm to the snowman.

Trace and cut out his hat. Sew and turn right side out. Add wool around the base of his hat with a few drops of hot glue. Attach his hat to his head by stitching it on.

#### **Needle Felting Eyes and Nose**

Take a small amount of black wool and use your felting needle to poke it into where you want his eye to go. Keep poking over and over until his eye is round and secure. Poke a small amount of antique white wool to create the white sparkle in his eye. Next take orange wool and felt onto his face for his nose.

## **His Scarf**

Cut a 1 inch wide x 12 inch long strip of homespun or whatever fabric you would like, for his scarf. Cut the ends about ½ inch so they look frayed. Tie around his neck around the top of his arms. This will also hide where you stitched on his arms.

## **Staining Him**

Use a spray bottle or wide flat paint brush and stain his entire body, including his scarf and hat. Use a blow dryer to speed up the drying of the stain. Stain again if you want him darker.

## **Add rusty bells and Finishing up**

Sew on a small rusty bell to the end of his hat. Fold his hat over. If it doesn't stay put, you can put a single stitch on the fabric to hold it in place. Stitch on 3 more rusty bells by going through the back of him and out through his front. Then go back through him again and tie off the thread in the back. Repeat this for each bell. Add a loop of thread at the back of his head for hanging him. NOTE: You can opt to make him with or without his hat. He also would make great bowl fillers.

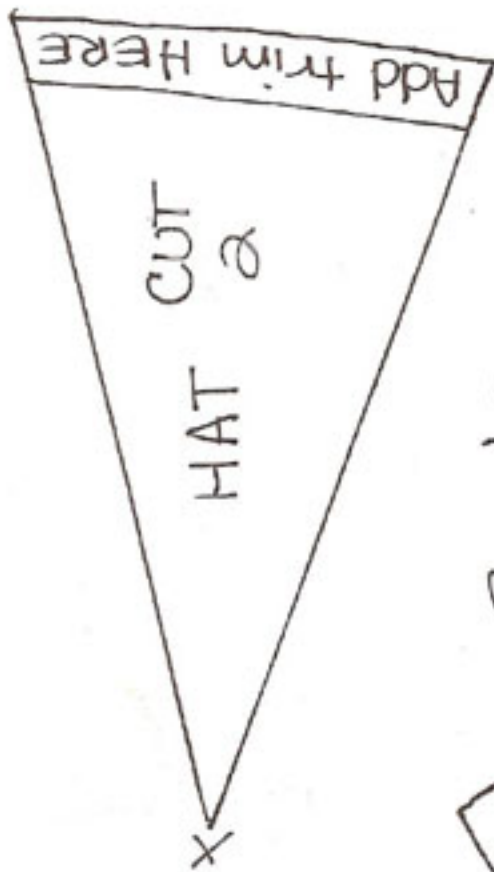
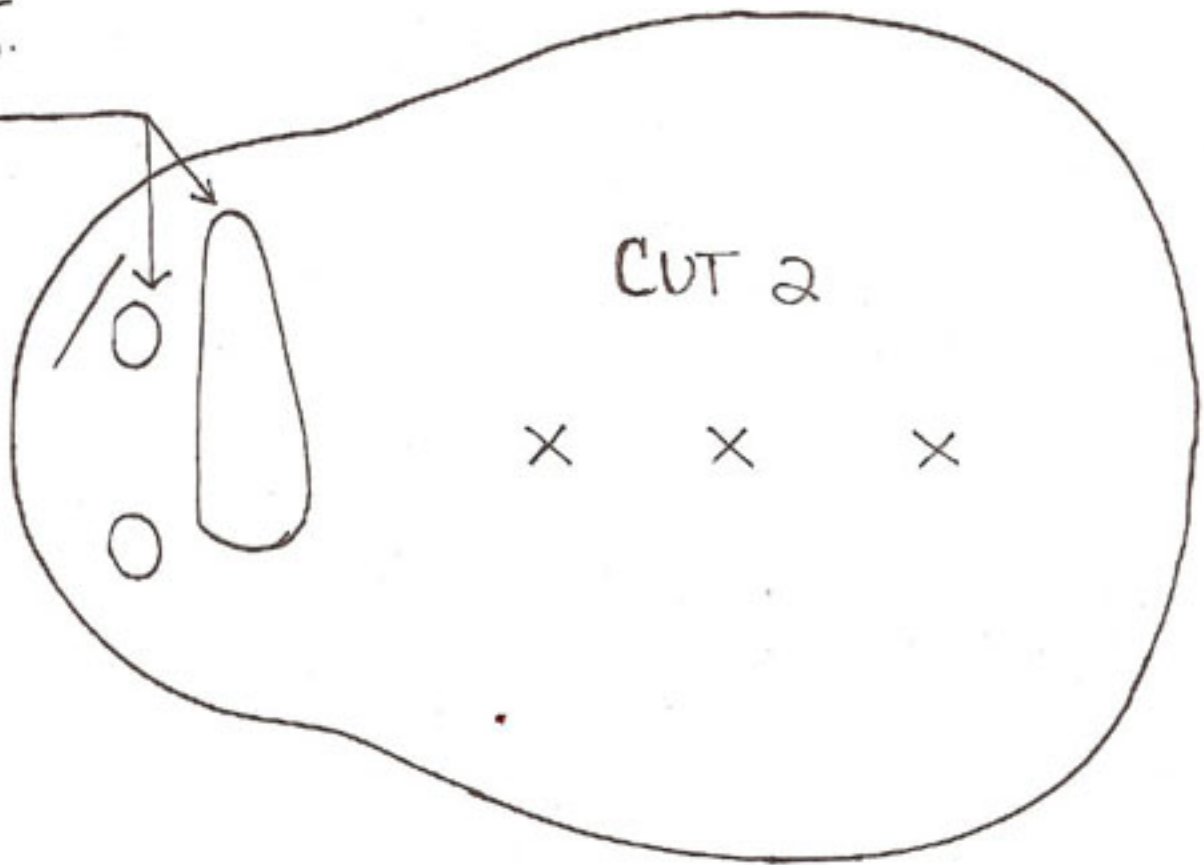
